Patrick Webster is a young paramedic whose life takes an abrupt turn when he falls in love with a young woman he saved following a car accident. Although he acknowledges that Sheila was driving under the influence, he cannot know the amount of damage her alcoholism will inflict-not only on their lives, but on the life of their future daughter. This book deals with three lives damaged by alcohol addition and Shreve raises the question of what can be done to save loved ones from self destruction especially when sometimes love is not enough.</p> <p>The Last Child by <i>John Hart</i>. This novel is my pick for the year. A touching story of a young boy's determined search for his missing twin sister. You won't want to put this story down as the mystery unfolds in ways you and Johnny, our young boy, can never imagine. Suspenseful, harsh, surprising and honest. One of the best stories I've read in a long time.</p>
